I wonder how people became slaves.

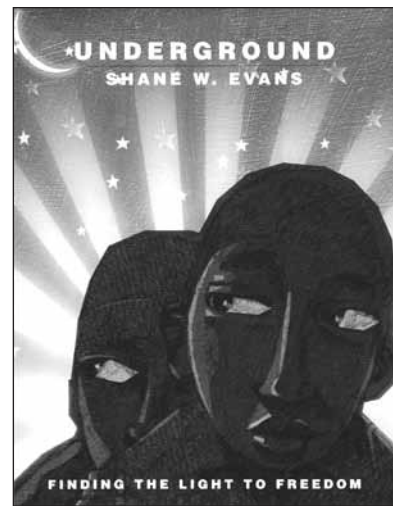
I wonder who started slavery.
